The Arthur Amos Marine Heritage Award

Application for Consideration in 2025

Aim of this Award

This award has been established to recognize the outstanding contributions made by Arthur Amos over the course of five decades of his pioneering work on marine archaeological sites in Ontario and beyond.

The award's purpose is to support and reward the initiation or continuation of a significant project that advances our knowledge and understanding of Ontario's maritime heritage through licenced archaeological fieldwork, or for exceptional work involving archival research or publication.

Who is Eligible?

The award is open to all members in good standing with the Ontario Marine Heritage Committee. Where required, all field work must be licenced by the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries to be eligible for funding.

Value

One cash award of \$500, awarded annually, with up to \$1,000 being available for significant projects.

Criteria and Selection Process:

To be considered for the award, the applicant must demonstrate that the work will add significantly to the body of knowledge of Ontario's maritime history. This should include a statement of support from someone with specific knowledge of the subject matter. Both new projects, and an additional season of work on a multi-year project will be considered (with a maximum of two awards for any one project). Applications will be assessed, in part, as to their compatibility with the research tradition personified by the work of Arthur Amos.

Deadline for Applications

Applications, in their complete form, must be submitted to the OMHC Executive Committee no later than March 31st in the year of the proposed project. Final decisions on project awards will be made by April 30 at the latest.
